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Summary of Delta South By-election

Reason for By-election

Liberal MLA Fred Gingell passed away on July 6, 1999. The by-election was held to fill the resulting vacancy in the Legislative Assembly.

The Electoral Event

On Tuesday, November 9, 1999, pursuant to Order in Council 1529, a Writ of Election was issued by the Chief Electoral Officer to Janice Cook, the District Electoral Officer for the Delta South electoral district. The Writ ordered that an election be held on December 7, 1999.

At the commencement of the by-election, temporary voter registration centres were set up in the electoral district at five locations with high pedestrian traffic. The centres were open from Wednesday, November 10, 1999 (Day 1) up to and including Tuesday, November 16, 1999 (Day 7).

Voter Registration Activity:

Under section 41 of the *Election Act*, voter registration and updating was available at all voting opportunities for qualified individuals who were not registered or who were no longer registered with the correct name or address.

There were 1,148 voter registration transactions completed at the time of voting, resulting in 921 new registrations and 227 updates to the Voters List for the Delta South electoral district.

One standing nomination was filed with the Chief Electoral Officer under section 57 of the *Election Act*. Nominations filed under section 56 of the *Election Act* were accepted by the District Electoral Officer from 9:00 a.m. Monday, November 15, 1999, until 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 24, 1999. At the close of nominations, six additional candidates had filed with the District Electoral Officer, for a total of seven candidates.

Alternative Absentee Voting commenced in the office of the District Electoral Officer on Wednesday, November 10, 1999.

The four consecutive days of Advance Voting began December 1, 1999, and 922 voters cast ballots during the Advance Voting period.

General Voting Day was Tuesday, December 7, 1999, with voting places open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. At the election, 17,778 voters, or 59.78% of registered voters, turned out to vote.

Final Count

Section 128 of the *Election Act* requires a 12-day delay before commencing Final Count unless an earlier time is authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer. At a by-election the period of delay is the time required to prepare for Final Count. As there were no coincidental by-elections, there was no Absentee Voting outside the electoral district, and consequently, no need to wait for ballots from other electoral districts. The Chief Electoral Officer authorized the District Electoral Officer to begin Final Count on December 13, 1999, and the count was concluded that day.

Official Results

At the conclusion of the Final Count on Monday, December 13, 1999, Val Roddick, the candidate endorsed by the BC Liberal Party, was declared elected as the Member to represent the Delta South electoral district in the Legislative Assembly. On Tuesday, December 21, 1999, the District Electoral Officer returned the Writ of Election to the Chief Electoral Officer, and on the following day the Chief Electoral Officer delivered a certified report to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly confirming the election of Val Roddick.

Financial Reporting

Financial information from all election financing reports submitted to Elections BC has been included in this report. The reports have not been reviewed by Elections BC.

The election financing information provided in this report includes both the total inflows and outflows of cash for each reporting entity. Total inflows and total outflows may not be equal. The most common cause of such a difference for candidates or registered political parties is when assets held prior to the campaign are used, and therefore reported as election expenses, but not as inflows. The inflows consist of three components; the first two are considered income, whereas the third is added to income to arrive at total inflows. The inflow components are as follows:

Political contributions - an amount of money or the value of any property or services provided without compensation by way of donation, advance, deposit, discount or otherwise.

Other income - derived from miscellaneous sources such as interest income or the portion of income from fundraising functions which is not reported as political contributions.

Transfers received - a non-reciprocal receipt of money, goods or services from a registered political party, registered constituency association or a candidate. In this report, transfers may not be reported consistently among registered political parties, registered constituency associations and candidates due to the fact that some entities included the transfer of goods, services and money, whereas others only reported the transfer of money.

The outflows are segregated into "Expenses Subject to Limits" and "Expenses Not Subject to Limits" (i.e. excluded expenses):

Expenses subject to limits - the value of property or services used during a campaign period, by or on behalf of a registered political party or a candidate to promote or oppose a registered political party or a candidate (e.g. advertising and office expenses). A campaign period is the time between when an election is called and the close of General Voting.

Expenses not subject to limits - election expenses specifically excluded from the election limit (e.g. nomination deposit and audit fees). This type of expense is described in section 203 of the *Election Act*.

Registered election advertising sponsors have explicit definitions of their sources and uses of funds:

Contributions consist of money provided to a sponsor, in relation to election advertising, whether given before or after the individual or organization acts as a sponsor.

Election advertising expenses refer to expenses incurred to sponsor advertising during a campaign period to promote or oppose, directly or indirectly, a candidate or a registered political party.

Filing Deadlines

The financial agent of a registered political party, registered constituency association or candidate must file an election financing report with the Chief Electoral Officer within 90 days after General Voting Day.

If, during a campaign period, a registered election advertising sponsor incurs election advertising expenses that exceed \$500, an election advertising disclosure report must be filed with the Chief Electoral Officer within 90 days after General Voting Day.

The deadline for filing campaign finance information was March 6, 2000. Details of these reports can be found starting on page 9.


